AQUATIC LANDS ENHANCEMENT ACCOUNT (ALEA) GRANT PROGRAM

Fred Kunzmann has been busy for a number of months, maybe years searching in the dusty nooks and crannies of county archives and he's discovered fifty five deeds that date back to the late 60's and early 70's. These documents are easements for public access to strips of land along the Wenatchee River between the Icicle and Columbia Rivers. Lands that are available to the public (insert fisher folks) for their recreational uses. Fred has teamed up with Bruce Merighi to apply for an ALEA Grant, with the blessing of the Board. This grant would be of no cost to the club, but would require some volunteer work down the road.

The grant is a two part project. Part 1 asks WFG to provided monies to identify current owners of these properties, since many things have changed since the '60s. It will also create high quality maps of the properties mentioned in the deeds and to exactly identify their locations.

Part 2 would be a separate grant, and if awarded it would cover the costs of contacting and meeting with the land owners, holding public meetings and ultimately signing the locations so everyone is clear on what public lands are available.

The lands in question are mostly 25' strips of land that stretch for as little as 30' or as long as 3,500' adjacent to the mean high water mark of the Wenatchee River. Accessible mostly from water craft, their uses would be less available than drive-in / walk-in easements to the river, but any spot that we can legally cast from is a bonus in my book.

Like any grant application it's a long shot but one that we feel is worth the hours already invested. Kudos to Fred for pursuing such a valuable and illusive quest. More information to come in future issues as it becomes available.

FLIES AFIELD



BOARD MEETING MINUTES FEB. 7, 2013

Minutes - The minutes of the January board and membership (banquet) were approved.

Treasurer Report- Bill Ward

- January financial report was not presented. For the record, the cash balance at 1/31/13 was \$26,090 compared to \$23,581 in 2012. The increase was caused by banquet receipts.
- The 2013 banquet resulted in a net income of \$4,684 compared to \$5,060 and \$4,889 in 2012 and 2011 respectively. The reduction was caused primarily by decreased raffle ticket sales and the live auction results.

Vice President Report – Robert Winters

- The Trout Unlimited monthly meeting will have an interesting speaker from Bristol Bay. WVFF members are welcome. Call Rob if you want more details.
- Pat Herdt called to make sure mention was included in this newsletter concerning the need for fly tiers at the Ellensburg Conclave in April.

Membership Report – Eric Rainbolt reported we have 80 members with 56 having paid their 2013 dues.

Outings Report– Tom Whiteside

- Tentative outings: 3/2 Yakima River 3/21 Lenice 4/6 Desert Lakes 4/27 & 8 Big Twin. Detailed information will be in the newsletter.
- There will be a new program this year- "Nites at the Heights"- where impromptu afternoon / evening outings to Beehive, Black Lake , Upper Wheeler, etc.

Newsletter Report – Bruce Meriahi

- Passed around a draft of the February newsletter noting several proposed changes.
- Discussed the questionnaire to be included. The Board moved, seconded and passed a motion to publish.

Environment / Youth Report- Don Bolstad

 - Upper Wheeler Discussed Gil Biles stepping back on his efforts. Steve Harvey and Steve Remmer have volunteered to step in and should be in touch with Gil.

Old Business

Web Site – We'd like to find someone who could get on top of this. If you're that person, please make yourself available. Otherwise, we may need to hire someone who could bring the site up to today's standards and maintain it going forward. This is important if we want to transition the club to a younger membership.

Budget – The proposed budget was reviewed, discussed and approved. Copies available at the next meeting.

Upper Wheeler - Access and Chelan County – Fred Kunzmann discussed the possible use of part of our funds to assist Chelan County in acquiring properties from a logging company in the Stemilt Hill area for some \$2,500,000. This will be an ongoing agenda item.

Wenatchee River Access – There have been many discussion in the past about river access being available from the Chelan PUD purchasing right of ways when the dams were built. The Ephrata office of WDF&G have contacted us concerning efforts to utilize these right of ways for fishing. Fred Kunzmann and Bruce Merighi are submitting a Part I of II, \$12,000 ALEA grant to discover all properties in question, identify the current owners and create a presentation map. Part II if awarded will be to contact the owners, hold public meetings and post signage. The meeting adjourned at 8:45
